LIVING THE GOSPEL OF LIFE

In their statement, Living the 18 of Life, the Bishops of the United States said:

"Opposition to abortion and euthanasia does not excuse indifference to those who suffer from poverty, violence and injustice. Any politics of human life must work to resist the violence of war and the scandal of capital punishment. Any politics of human dignity must seriously address issues of racism, poverty, hunger, employment, education, housing, and health care. Therefore, life. But being 'right' in such matters can never excuse a wrong choice regarding direct attacks on innocent human life.
