MAKE THE MOST OF ADVENT

The season of Advent is designed to help us prepare to celebrate Jesus' birth at Christmas. Think of it: God became man, died for our sins, rose from the dead, and now reigns as King of all creation. Every Christmas is a chance to welcome Jesus as an honored guest into our hearts. Think of all the planning, cooking, and cleaning needed to have a guest over. In Advent we prepare our hearts to welcome the Savior. A rich Advent makes a joyous Christmas. Use the four weeks before Christmas to prepare for Christ's coming.



THE ADVENT WREATH

Since circles have no beginning and no end, the circular shape of the Advent Wreath symbolizes eternal life in Christ. The wreath holds four or five candles. Each candle represents an aspect of the spiritual preparation for the coming of the Lord. Generally, three are violet which symbolize penance, sacrifice and prayer and are lite during the first, second and fourth weeks. The one rose-colored, is called Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday and is lite on the third week of Advent. On this day we celebrate that our wait is almost over. The color represents joy. The four candles each represent 1,000 years. Added together, the four candles symbolize the 4,000 years that humanity waited for the Savior. The fifth candle (white) reminds us that Jesus is the spotless Lamb of God sent to wash away our sins. His birth was for his death. His death was for our birth.
